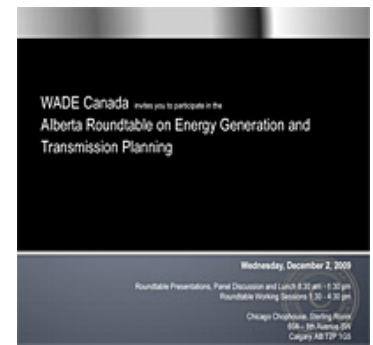

HOT NEWS - Alberta business leaders scheduled to meet in Calgary, on Wednesday December 2 to discuss energy generation and transmission planning for the province.

WADE Canada is hosting a roundtable discussion with Alberta energy businesses to develop recommendations for planning Alberta's energy future. The roundtable opens with presentations from some of North America's most progressive energy leaders in energy procurement and transmission. The outcome of the session will be recommendations that will be submitted to the Alberta Government to support the development of binding targets for decentralized energy in Alberta. WADE Canada Member News - The Municipality of Chatham Kent, Enbridge and RES Canada Team Up on 99 MW Talbot Wind Energy Project, November 19.

Enbridge Inc. and Renewable Energy Systems Canada Inc. (RES Canada) an affiliate of RES Americas, announced on November 19, that they have entered into an agreement to develop a 99 megawatt (MW) wind energy project near Chatham, Ontario in which Enbridge will have a majority interest. The total investment in the project by both parties is approximately \$285 million. The Project will be structured as a limited partnership owned by Enbridge and RES Canada.

"The positive steps the Ontario government is taking to encourage and support a thriving renewable energy industry, combined with our existing presence through the 190 MW Enbridge Ontario Wind Project, make the Talbot Wind Energy Project an excellent fit with Enbridge's strategy to expand its renewable energy platform across Canada and the U.S.," said Patrick D. Daniel, President and Chief Executive Officer, Enbridge Inc.

WADE Canada President, Anouk Kendall, attended the 2009 APPrO conference held at the Metro Toronto Convention Centre on November 17 & 18.

The conference addressed key issues pertinent to making the power system cleaner, greener and smarter. These issues included:

- Ontario's Green Energy Act
- The Feed In Tariff program (Including a parallel mini-conference on the FIT program)
- US-Canada energy trade opportunities
- Aboriginal and community-based power project development
- Climate change rules, their relevance for generators
- Major transmission development
- The changing framework for distribution connections
- Gas market issues

There were more than 80 speakers from the power industry, academia, government and the legal profession. More than 1200 people were registered for the combined conference and trade show.

"This year's APPrO conference was outstanding. Ontario is experiencing unprecedented changes in the energy industry. Rapid reform brings an element of uncertainty, which was an important theme of this year's conference. The talent and experience at the APPrO indicates that Ontario business will quickly work through the wrinkles in the changing industry and turn change into huge opportunities" remarks Kendall.

WADE Canada Vice President, Geraldine Byrne, attended a conference on Northern Issues related to energy extraction and environmental protection, hosted by Canada's School of Energy and Environment (CSEE) on October 22 and 23.

Byrne attended the workshop along with Aboriginal and Territorial leaders, Federal and Provincial Cabinet Ministers as well as informed policy leaders with direct responsibility for Northern issues. The results of the workshop will inform a larger conference on Northern issues in the Spring 2010. WADE Canada is collaborating with CSEE in shaping a Northern strategy, which will address decentralized energy development and environmental protection for Northern Canada.
